 - ∞ *Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.* The Rocky Mountain Forum does collect information about our visitors on our server logs. The information collected includes: who visited as identified by their IP address, what pages were displayed, when the visit was made, how long they visited for, what browser they were using, what operating system was running on the computer, the last page they visited before coming to our site, if they found us in a search engine and the terms they used to search for us and whether they were a first time or repeat visitor. This information is used solely to assist us in making this web site as accessible and the experience as enjoyable as we can for all of our visitors. We will never use any "tracking" or "web-bugs." All of the images on our pages are visible and served directly from the Rocky Mountain Forum web server. None of our pages contain invisible text.

WHAT YOU SEE IS WHAT YOU GET!

We will make every possible effort to protect our visitors' information with the same zeal we protect our own anonymity. No personal information is required to access these pages and an e-mail address is only required if you wish to get a response from the trusted servants of this body. Our discussion board does use a small text file called a "cookie" to store session information between the web pages a visitor views. This text file expires when the visitor leaves our site and is deleted when the visitor closes their browser.
